

# SIS20419 Certificate II in Outdoor Recreation

## **Description:**

This qualification reflects the role of individuals who assist with operational logistics and the delivery of recreational activities. They work under direct supervision and with guidance from those responsible for planning, finalising and delivering activities, including program managers and leaders.

Assistants use a range of fundamental activity techniques during activities and can work in indoor and outdoor recreation environments, adventure learning centres or camps. The combined skills and knowledge provided by this qualification do not provide for a job outcome as a leader and further training would be required before moving into those roles.

This qualification provides a pathway to work for any type of organisation that delivers outdoor recreation activities including commercial, not-for-profit and government organisations.

No occupational licensing, certification or specific legislative requirements apply to this qualification at the time of publication

- A PADI Open Water Dive Certification (**students will need to undertake the Scuba Diving Units to be awarded with an Open Water Dive Certificate**)

### Careers & Pathways:

### Entry Requirements:

Students must complete the PADI medical exam to be able to do the SCUBA Units of this qualification

### Delivery Mode:

Students are able to choose from the following delivery modes:

- Option 1: 10-week semester course
  - One half-day per working week (totalling five days) and
  - Three weekend days (totalling three days)
  - Self-paced distance delivery

- Option 2: 6-week semester course
  - One half-day per week (totalling three days) and
  - Two and half weekend days (totalling five days)
  - Self-paced distance delivery
  
- Option 3: 8-day School Holiday course
  - Eight consecutive days, including Saturday and Sunday
  - Self-paced distance delivery

Please note: all options are 6 months in duration

### **Method of Delivery**

The Certificate II in Outdoor Recreation will include face-to-face training, e-learning units for the SCUBA and Boating clusters and in-water activities. The course will also include various on-line and study activities (approximately 5 hours per week for the whole duration of the course).

Students undertaking the SCUBA electives will undertake four (4) open water dives. These dives will be completed over a three (3) day duration during the face-to-face component of the School Holiday Course or over 2 days outside the semester programs).

The duration of the course is six (6) months, however this may vary depending on a student's commitment to the training plan.

### **Admission Requirements:**

#### **Technology**

As some of the resources are contained in a dedicated learner portal, a student must have access to a computer (with Microsoft Office software).

Students will need to bring a laptop to class with them as they will need to be able to access their student learner portal throughout their classroom training and assessments.

Free Wi-Fi is available during training.

As students will undertake training in the use of the QMTS student portal they will require basic computer skills to complete the course without disadvantage.

### **Enrolment Documentation**

When enrolling into a QMTS course it is a requirement that all enrolment documentation is received before enrolment confirmation can occur. The required documents and information are listed below:

- Pre-Enrolment Form (Personal Details)
- Client Enrolment Form
- Enrolment/Induction Checklist
- Medical Declaration (and SCUBA Dive assessment) for those students undertaking the SCUBA electives.
- Letter of Confirmation (completed by the student's school)

**Please also note that Students will be required to provide QMTS Training with their Unique Student Identifier (USI) before enrolment can be completed.**



### **Please Note:**

Students will be expected to complete the e-learning unit for power boating prior to the first day of class.

### **Student completing the SCUBA Electives:**

1. Students will be required to complete the e-learning unit for SCUBA prior to the first day of class.
2. If completing a semester course, the open water dive assessment (cost inclusive of course) must be pre-booked by the student at least one week in advance (weather dependant). Assessment will take place at either Sunreef Diving Facilities in Mooloolaba or Royal Queensland Yacht Squadron Manly.

### **Course Fees**

No cost for students eligible for VETiS Funding (see below eligibility requirements)

Fee-for-Service Cost: \$2,400.00

### **To be eligible for VET in Schools (VETiS) funding students must:**

- be 15 years or older
- be in Years 10, 11 and 12 in a Queensland High School
- permanently reside in Queensland
- be an Australian citizen, Australian permanent resident (including humanitarian entrants), temporary resident with the necessary visa and work permits on the pathway to permanent residency, or a New Zealand citizen; **and**
- not hold, and not be enrolled in another Qualification through VETiS.

## Recognition Processes:

Learners are able to have their competency from prior learning and work experience recognised in this qualification through the following arrangements:

### **Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)**

RPL is recognition of prior learning or skills obtained from previous study or work/life experience.

Learners, who through prior learning or experience believe they have gained competence in any of the skill areas, may be granted RPL upon substantiation of that claim. QMTS offers RPL on enrolment and the trainer will work with the student to define the potential for a successful application process.

**NB:** RPL does not give the student a discount in course fees.

### **Credit Transfer**

Students may also apply for a credit transfer upon enrolment.

Learners who have evidence in the form of AQF certification from any other RTO or authenticated VET transcripts issued by the Registrar or from an AQF authorised issuing authority for units of competency relevant to this qualification will be given credit upon enrolment.
